Trax FM AGM 2023 Technical Report

This year our lease at the Bluff for our transmitter is changing to a national park. During the changeover (which will take about twelve months) the Department of Environment and Water are our temporary landlords. When the transfer is complete I expect that we will have to negotiate a new lease with Parks and Wildlife. The new park is called Wapma Thura – Southern Flinders Ranges National Park.

I have had discussions with SA Power Networks about their access to our transmitter site and this has not currently been resolved, but there is a solution if we work together.

Due to our extremely tight financial situation technical activities are restricted to care and maintenance with any additions restricted to what I can afford to pay for myself. I have in progress a small remote switch under construction to enable us to switch between studios and outside broadcast which will make operations smoother. This will also be able to work with remote control from outside the station in an emergency.

Our equipment is getting older (approaching 20 years an many cases) and I read some disturbing news this week that the manufacturer of our studio desks has apparently closed his website. This means that supply of spare parts has dried up. Our desks could continue to function for many years yet, but a failure will mean that we will need to use the production studio for spares. Ultimately we would need to consider upgrading but this will need to wait until our finances are in better shape.

This year we have changed email, internet and telephone providers as our previous providers (Telstra, iiNET and Internode) have gradually withdrawn their services. We now use Aussie Broadband for internet and telephone and Ventra IP for email and domain name management. The changeover was made smooth by their excellent telephone help lines which are all in Australia.

I have been considering what we need to do if we should have to close down and what sort of costs are involved for us to do that. There are many options but I am hoping that we can avoid this by working hard to recover our position to where we were four or five years ago. Then we can plan progressive replacement of essential equipment.

On a brighter note yesterday I replaced the audio interface from the computer to the desk in our studio with a spare I had at home. This will eliminate to loss of audi problems we have experienced in the last few weeks due to Windows 10 not behaving after upgrading. I am currently working on the second computer in the studio to improve performance.

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Open Day and 30th birthday celebrations including our visitors from Pt Augusta and Whyalla. You made the day very worthwhile and I hope you went away knowing a little more about our operations. We have a Garage Sale on 18th November.

Thank you also to everyone who helps to keep our premises clean and tidy throughout the year. Harness Racing Port Pirie have been beautifying our surroundings and they have more in the pipeline.
